## **Graphic Design**

Interaction and Environment

Exploring how creative works can be situated in differing environments, and providing opportunities to inform, agitate, navigate, and enrich people's lives. You develop an understanding of how design and illustration is being used, and could be used in, innovative ways in commercial, social and public indoor and outdoor settings. Your project allows you to research, develop and apply innovative conceptual solutions of your own in an interactive design project.

# **Fashion Design/ Product Design**

Global Sustainable Contexts

investigate a range of contemporary social, environmental, technological and ethical issues that inform fashion. This project will broaden your understanding of fashion and design as a form of contemporary social discourse and explore a variety of issues through the development, production and presentation of potential future scenarios.

## **Interior Design**

Emerging Spatial Trends: Wellbeing and Sustainability

You investigate the links between interior design and the built environment with new thinking on designing for health and wellbeing for sustainable future design. Promoting health and wellbeing through new materials and biophilic trends has rapidly gathered momentum and you will consider new approaches to design for future homes and buildings.

### Brief.

The design students on the UG fellowship 23 will be asked to form small design Teams of 4-5 people each exploring one of the above themes. The project will be formed from initial design ideation and problem solving excercises which explore the social, economic, technical and conceptual approaches to design problem solving. The students will then be guided through the design process and solutions to the issues raised supervised by a researcher who will guide them through the research process. The students will be asjed to consider real world concepts that make a difference to society and people lives pitching their completed concept through a 30 mins group pitch supported by visual and accompanying models and vsiualisations etc.

The students will be challenged at the outset of the programme by key note lectures by researchers and art and design practitioners in the university and the ideas presented will help to inform their design and development process
